



2020 Cincinnati Region Civic Board & Commission Data

As of 2020, the Cincinnati region has 381 total civic boards and commissions large governments, excluding gender equity focused bodies. By examing the gender demographics, we can highlight a clear gender gap among the appointees to civic bodies. Below is the analysis of gender demographics for county-level and large municipalities civic boards and commissions.

Civic Board and Commission Gender Demographics

Key Findings:


- Of the 2,376 current members of large government civic boards, only 32% of seats are held by women.
- 23% of boards have exclusivly male appointees from an appointing government compared to less than 3% of exclusively female appointees.
- While women do not hold a majority of seats within any of the board and commissions' categories, women have a significant share of Arts & Humanities (46.91%) and Health & Human Services (46.93%) boards. While men hold about 75% of the seats on boards within Land Use, Transportation & Other categories and hold a slightly higher share of seats on Economic Development & Tax/ Finance boards.

Board & Commission Category Key:

ARTS & HUMANITIES (A&H)	Boards concerning subject matters related to art, education, gender equity and children.
ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT & TAX/FINANCE (ED&TF)	Boards concerning subject matters related to consumer safety, economic development, labor, tourism, tax and trade.
HEALTH & HUMAN SERVICES (HHS)	Boards concerning subject matters related to physical and mental health, poverty, social services and child/elder care.
LAND USE (LAND)	Boards concerning subject matters related to agriculture, building/code enforcement, housing, property/ real estate, planning and zoning.
TRANSPORTATION (TRANS)	Boards concerning subject matters related to air, ground and public transportation.
OTHER (OTHER)	Boards concerning subject matters related to animal management, civil rights/ liberties, criminal justice, elections, emergency services, immigration, law/ legal services and public serves/ utilities.
